



Rules, Deadlines and Details for the Event

- Event will be held at the Andrews County Event Center, 1441 E Highway 176, Andrews, Texas
- Printable entry forms may be mailed and are available on the FORMS tab (<http://www.ll2fbarrelrace.com/Forms.html>). No Call-in pre-entries accepted!
- **Pre-entry deadline:** Mailed entries must be postmarked by Friday, September 25, 2026. Online entries will be accepted without a late fee until midnight September 25, 2026.
- Online entries will be available through the NextGenRodeo app beginning September 14, 2026 through October 9, 2026. Online entries after midnight September 25, 2026 will be assessed a \$10 late fee.
- Entries after that date will be subject to a \$10 late fee per contestant, per office visit. Entries will be taken onsite until runner #100 completes their run on both Saturday and Sunday. **Onsite entries must pay with Cash or Credit Card, NO Checks will be accepted onsite.**
- Age for 8 & Under, Youth, Adult and Senior will be the age as of October 16, 2026.
- Must enter and run in the same class on the same horse on both days prior to your first run to be eligible for awards!
- Sweet Stakes sidepot is a \$150 entry fee, 90% payback in a 3D format with a ½ second split.
- Entries for the \$1,000 Added 4D Warm Up race will be taken onsite only (no pre-entries), no late fee. Books will remain open until the last 25 runners to allow for people to travel. Fees are \$15 for 8 & Under, \$50 for Open 4D with Youth, Adult and Senior Sidepots \$15.
- It pays to attend church at LL2F! We will be giving away 50 tickets at church. One ticket pays for one horse/rider entry for the Warm-Up race only. You will take your ticket to the entry desk for your refund for the Friday (10/16/2026) Warm-Up. Jesus has already done it all ❤️ !
- 8 & Under 3D Class is \$20 entry fee and will pay back 80% in a 3D format with 1 second splits. There will be no office or late fee charged for contestants entering the 8 & Under Class only. If the contestant chooses to carry-over or run in the Open class, they will be assessed the same fees as all Open contestants. Times from 8 & Under may carry over to the 5D Open, but may NOT carryover to the Youth.

- 5D Open on Saturday and Sunday is a \$60 entry fee and will payback 100% of added money and 80% entry fees in a 5D format with ½ second splits.
- Buckles will be awarded to the Open and 8&U average (Saturday & Sunday) winners in each “D”, other prizes for second through fourth places. Average is prizes only, no payout.
- Youth (9-18), Adult (19-49) and Senior (50 & Over) are \$25 entry fee, 80% payback in a 4D format and are paid out on ½ second split. Incentives (sidepots) are additional chances to win money and will NOT have any average or awards.
- **Draw Outs:** Draw outs without a release will be accepted until Friday, October 9, 2026. If you entered through the NextGenRodeo app you may draw out using the app, if you mailed in your entry you will need to contact Kirstin Carlson, 575-706-2404. After Friday, October 9, 2026, draw outs will ONLY be accepted with a valid doctor/vet release until the race starts each day. Vet releases must be on official letterhead and signed. Contact Kirstin Carlson, 575-706-2404 or kirstinjacarlson@hotmail.com for draw outs.
- Any holes in the draw from vet outs WILL NOT be backfilled for any reason.
- **Exhibitions:** Exhibitions will be sold through the NextGenRodeo app beginning September 14, 2026. You may purchase them separately from your entry. Any remaining exhibitions will be sold onsite when the books open Friday, October 16, 2026.
- **Draw:** Pre-entry draw will be posted on or before Wednesday, October 14, 2026 on the NextGenRodeo app. We will also post a copy on our website www.LL2FBarrelRace.com.
- **WPRA Dress Code is required for all riders on Saturday and Sunday!** Contestants must wear long-sleeved shirts that are collared and have either buttons, snaps or full-length zipper on the front of the shirt. Jeans without holes, western boots and western hat or helmet. Riders who choose not to follow dress code will receive a NO TIME for their ride(s)! - Negative Coggins required on ALL horses.
- RV & Camper Hookups and Stall Rentals are available and handled by the ACE Arena via www.OpenStalls.com
- We work hard to minimize errors, but as we are not perfect, please notify us of any errors in your entry information as soon as possible.
- **Check In:** Upon your arrival, you must check in at the Stall Office for any stalls or RVs. It is not necessary to check-in with the Event Office concerning your entry, but we encourage all contestants to confirm their race positions with the draw sheets that will be posted and check all incentives.
- **Horse Substitution:** You may substitute a horse, however if the horse is already entered you cannot change draw position. Any horse substitution must

be made with the show secretary, in writing using the Change form. All horse changes must be submitted on a Change Form and a \$10 fee will apply.

- **Rider Substitution:** Any rider substitution/change must be made with the show secretary, in writing using the change form before the first horse runs. \$10.00 fee
- **Selling a Run:** Selling a run is not allowed. You must draw out completely.
- **Sportsmanship:** All contestants and their family members are expected to display good sportsmanship at all times. No level of abuse toward any animal at this event will be allowed. Foul language, misconduct, or abusive comments spoken to any contestant, spectator, staff member, or arena personnel will result in immediate contestant disqualification and no refund of entry fees. Contestants are also responsible for traveling companions and their family members.
- **Fines:** 100% of all fines will be donated to the Kelsey Mae Davis Scholarship.
- **Returned Checks:** There is a **\$100 service charge** on all returned checks from the bank, for any reason.
- **Dogs:** Dogs must be on a leash at all times.
- **Turn Out Rules:** Contestant shall identify themselves to the Gate Man and be in the holding area five horses before their run. The Gate Man will be located next to the alleyway going into the arena. This will be your 1st call. The announcer will call your name for the 2nd and 3rd call. If you are not in the arena by the 3rd call you shall be disqualified
- **Time Begins:** Any time a contestant crosses the starting line, the time will begin.
- **No Time:** A "No Time" will be given to the contestant for the following reasons:
 - If the contestant "circles" their horse after entering or exiting the arena. (Definition of the Arena is past the plane of the alley)
 - If the contestant breaks or misses the barrel pattern.
 - If the contestant runs out of turn. It is the contestant's responsibility to know their draw position.
 - If a contestant knocks over a barrel. A "no time" will also be given if a barrel is knocked over and it sets up again on either end. Touching a barrel, including keeping it from falling, is permitted without penalty.
 - If the contestant's horse or rider falls during the run in such a manner as to break the pattern, or if the rider falls off the horse after entering past the plane of the alley.
 - If a horse stops forward motion.
 - If you feel that you have been fouled for some reason, it is your responsibility to pull up and declare the foul to the gateman.
- **Barrel Moved:** If a barrel moved off its marker during competition, the barrel must be reset prior to the next competitor's run.
- **Horse and Rider Rule:** A contestant may enter on whatever horse they choose or as many horses as they wish. However, a horse/rider combination is

considered one entry, and horse may not be entered by the same rider more than once. Also, a horse may not be shown by more than one person unless both contestants are members of the same immediate family and in no case shall the horse be entered more than twice. Under no circumstances will sharing of horses be allowed if one of the family members has more than one horse entered, unless each family member is entered in a separate class and not competing against each other.

- **Re-Runs:** Re-runs shall be granted if the official and backup timer both fail to work properly, unless a barrel has been turned over resulting in a no-time. If the barrels are not placed properly on their markers, a re-run shall also be granted without any penalties being applied; however, any penalty occurring on the re-run shall result in a no time. If a rider feels that they have been fouled or compromised in any way, it is the rider's responsibility to pull up and declare the foul to the gate man.
- **Training in Arena:** Contestants who are given a "no time," either for breaking the pattern or knocking down a barrel, may complete the pattern. However, show management may, at its discretion, ask a rider who is taking excessive time to train to leave the arena immediately. If such request is not complied with, a \$25 fine may be assessed.
- **Tie for Prizes:** If any contestants' times are tied, the prize money will be split equally. Numbers will be drawn and prizes will be awarded based on the order of highest to lowest, with the highest number receiving the largest prize.
- **Payout Requirements:** To receive your money, you must fill out a W-9 (regardless of the amount won) complete with address, social security number and signature within 90 days of the event or all monies will be forfeited.
- **Disqualifications:** Any act deemed prejudicial to the best interests of Live Life to the Fullest may result in the disqualification of the contestant, with no refund of entry fees. These acts may include but are not limited to the following:
 - Using abusive or intemperate language or attempting to threaten, bribe, influence, or harass any contestant, spectator, staff member, or Arena Personnel. Also, any remarks made with the intent to cast aspersions on the character or integrity of an LL2F staff member or management member.
 - Moving or attempting to move markers at any time.
 - Use of electronic and/or remotely controlled devices to alter the outcome of a run.
 - Abuse of a horse in any way either on the ground or in the saddle. No Whipping a horse from the ground by a bystander.

- Abuse of an animal in the show arena and/or evidence that an act of abuse has occurred prior to or during the exhibition of a horse in competition.
 - Competing while under the influence of drugs or alcohol.
 - Misidentifying a horse in any LL2F Barrel Race class.
 - Misidentifying a rider in any LL2F Barrel Race class.
 - Other conduct that is not in the best interest of LL2F, or its contestants.
 - Failure to make good on a returned check to LL2F.
 - The LL2F at their sole discretion shall have the authority to disqualify or deny entry to any horse they deem dangerous to the rider, or to other individuals, animals or property.
- **Safety:** Safety is a prime objective at this barrel race. If you have a horse that could be dangerous to yourself, other contestants, or other horses, DO NOT come to this barrel race. Any horse or contestant deemed to be dangerous by the management of LL2F will be disqualified and entry fees will not be refunded.
 - **Rules:** The management of LL2F reserves the right to create any new rule, or modify any existing rule, in order to better the sport of this barrel race. Please note that the rules appearing on the boards at the event take precedence over the web site and any other postings. All announcements at show supersede printed material.
